## DOCTRINE OF HELL AND HADES

## 1. Sheol or Hades:

- a. <u>Sheol</u> שָׁאוֹל (Heb., noun, common) A subterranean place full of thick darkness where the dead are gathered. (Num. 16:30; Deut. 32:22; Isa. 14:9-11; 38:10, 18; Ps. 86:13; 55:15; Amos 9:2; Jonah 2:2)
- b. <u>Chedel</u> תָּדֶל (Heb., noun, masc.) The resting place for the dead. (Isa. 38:11) found <u>only once</u>.
- c. <u>Maveth</u>- מָוֶת (Heb., n., m., const.) The place or abode of the dead (Job 28:22; Ps. 9:13; Prov. 7:27; Isa. 38:18)
- d. <u>Hades</u> ἄδης (Gk., n., m,) The underworld as the place of the dead (Matt. 16:18; Lk. 16:23; Rev. 1:18; 6:8; 20:13, 14)

## 2. Compartments of Sheol/Hades: (Luke 16:19-31)

- a. <u>Paradise</u>- παράδεισος (Gk., n., m.)
  - (1) The abode of believers who had died before the resurrection of Jesus Christ. (Lk. 23:43)
  - (2) After the resurrection of Jesus Christ, this compartment of Sheol/Hades along with all believers who have ever died were moved into the very presence of God. (2 Cor. 12:4; Eph. 4:8-10; Rev. 2:7; cf. Rom. 10:6, 7)
- b. <u>Abraham's Chest (cavity)</u> κόλπος kolpos (Gk., n., m.)
  - (1) Chest A fold in a garment used as a pocket; bay, gulf
  - (2)<u>"Abraham's Chest (cavity)</u>" (Lk. 16:22, 23) The place of believers who had died prior to the resurrection of Jesus Christ. (See: "Paradise," Lk. 23:43)
- <u>Torment(s)</u> βάσανος basanos (Gk., n., fem.) Torture, <u>torment</u>, great pain.
   (Lk. 16:23, 28) The place or abode of all unbelievers who have died throughout all human history.
- d. <u>Tartaros</u> ταρταρό<sub>ζ</sub> (Gk., noun) From verb ταρταρόω to hold captive in tartarus. The prison of some fallen angels (demons). (2 Pet. 2:4; cf. Gen. 6:1-4; Jude 6; cf. 1 Pet. 3:19, 20)
- e. <u>The Bottomless Pit</u> (τὸ φρέαρ τῆς ἀβύσσος)
  (1) <u>Pit</u> φρέαρ phrear (Gk., noun, neuter) well, pit,shaft (Rev. 9:1, 2)
  (2) <u>Bottomless</u> ἀβυσσος abussos (Gk., noun, fem.) unfathomable depth, abyss, underworld abode of the dead (Rom. 10:7; Rev. 11:7; 17:8) and of demons (Lk. 8:31; Rev. 9:1, 2, 11; 20:1, 3)

(3) Probably refers to *"tartaros"*, the prison of the fallen angels in Lk. 8:31; Rev. 9:1, 2, 11; 20:1, 3 and *"torments"* in Rom. 10:7; Rev. 11:7; 17:8.

## 3. <u>Hell</u>:

- a. <u>Ge' hinnom</u> גֵי הָנָם (Heb., n.)
  - (1) Valley of Hinnom, a ravine south of Jerusalem, place of child sacrifice. (2 Kg. 23:10; Jer. 7:31; 15:8; 19:2-6; cf. Isa. 66:24)
  - (2) Later, the garbage dump for Jerusalem
  - (3) A place of eternal fire for punishment of the devil and his angels (Matt. 25:41) and the unbelieving dead of all human history.
- b. <u>Geenna</u> γέεννα (Gk., noun, fem.) same as (a.) above; (12xNT). (Matt. 5:22, 29, 30; 10:28; 18:9; 23:15, 33; Mk. 9:43, 45, 47; Lk. 12:5; James 3:6)
- 4. <u>Eight synonyms for "Hell"</u> (the eternal punishment for those who reject God's Salvation)
  - a. <u>Gehenna</u> See: point #3
  - b. <u>The Lake of Fire</u> (5xN.T) Rev. 19:20; 20:10, 14, 15
  - c. <u>The Second Death</u> (4xN.T.) Rev. 2:11; 20:6, 14; 21:8)
  - d. <u>Eternal Fire</u> (3xN.T.) Matt. 25:41; Rev. 14:10, 11
    (1)<u>unquenchable fire</u> Isa. 66:24; Matt. 3:12; Mk. 9:43,48; Lk. 3:17
    (2)<u>fire</u> Mark 9:49; 2 Pet. 3:7; Jude 23
  - e. <u>Outer Darkness</u> (3xN.T.) Matt. 8:12; 22:13; 25:30
  - f. Black Darkness (2xN.T.) 2 Pet. 2:17; Jude 13
  - g. <u>Resurrection of Judgement</u> (1xN.T.) Jn. 5:29b (cf. unbeliever's resurrection Acts 24:15)
  - h. Eternal Punishment (1xN.T.) Matt. 25:46 (cf. eternal abhorrence, Dan. 12:2)
- 5. Those who believe in the Lord Jesus Christ:
  - a. They have everlasting life in the presence of God (Jn. 3:15-17, 36; 5:24, 29; John 6:29; 11:25, 26; 20:31; Acts 16:31; 1 Jn. 5:11-13)
  - b. They do <u>not ever</u> enter Hell. (Jn. 3:18; 5: 24; Rom. 8:1; 31-39; 1 Cor. 11:32; Rev. 3:5; 20:15)
  - c. Resurrection to life (John 5:29a)
